

WHY MALTA?

What better way to learn English than to study on a sunny island in the heart of the Mediterranean where English is an official language?

Mostly known for its crystal clear waters, all year-round mild Mediterranean climate and the locals' hospitality, Malta has been welcoming English language students for more than half a century and has earned a reputation as a centre of excellence in the EFL industry.

Malta boasts one of the lowest crime rates in Europe, making it a safe language study destination. It is easy and relatively cheap to get around by public transport and the distances you have to travel are quite short. In fact, it won't take you more than an hour to get from one tip of the island to the other!

Yet despite Malta's small size, you will be amazed by what the island has to offer. With over 7000 years of history, there is no shortage of historical sites to visit. Just walk through the streets of the capital city Valletta, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the European Capital of Culture 2018, and admire the numerous architectural treasures all over the city. And if you really want to experience a sense of history, make sure you visit some of the oldest temples in the world – Ggantija, Hagar Qim, Mnajdra and the Hypogeum – the only known prehistoric underground temple in the world.

A Self-Access Centre/Library is available for you to borrow learning tools such as dictionaries, DVDs and graded readers. If you prefer to follow the afternoon lesson with another student, you can choose the Semi-Intensive option.

LONG-TERM

This **30 lesson course** is offered by Executive Training Institute, located within the ESE building and is designed for adults in the 30+ age bracket who want to develop their core language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) and improve their grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation.

MINI CLASS 20/30

In small groups of 6, you improve your level of English across the 4 core language skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing), broaden your vocabulary, improve your grammar and your pronunciation around topics which are stimulating and relevant to the modern world.

The Mini Class small group size means that you have more individual attention and opportunities to interact with your multinational classmates and your teacher. This means that you have more opportunities to practise your skills and benefit from more personalised feedback throughout the course.

PRIVATE TUITION

Individual lessons with a teacher allow you to focus on your specific learning needs and objectives. Your teacher carries out a needs analysis with you at the start of your course to determine which language skills and areas of language you wish to focus on so the course content is developed entirely around your needs.

BUSINESS ENGLISH

Following a Business English course will allow you to improve your English for career or work purposes. The course is geared to developing your English across the 4 core language skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing) and helping you become more fluent and confident when speaking about business-related topics such as Sales, Human Resources, Manufacturing etc. Plenty of practice opportunities in realistic scenarios such as meetings, interviews and other business-related role plays are set up by your teacher so that you can practise using your new language skills. You also develop your knowledge of language (grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation) and business skills around general business topics and recent current affairs.

BUSINESS ENGLISH INTENSIVE

The Business Intensive course combines group sessions with private tuition. This combination of study modes means that you benefit from group interaction as well as one-to-one attention from your teacher and the opportunity to focus specifically on your learning needs.

In the one-to-one sessions, it's up to you what to focus on. Perhaps you prefer to expand your business vocabulary or improve your pronunciation to be understood more easily when conducting business with other non-native speakers of English. EXAM PREPARATION COURSES

You may need to sit for an internationally-recognised English exam because you are planning to study at university at undergraduate or postgraduate level or perhaps you need an exam result to get a job or improve your career prospects.

IELTS

International English Language Testing System – For university admission or migration purposes.

If you want to pursue your studies at university in the UK, Australia, Canada or New Zealand, you will need a 5.5 band score or better in the IELTS Academic option.

The General training IELTS option is intended for candidates who are seeking to migrate and may be required by students who intend following vocational or non-academic training.

CAMBRIDGE MAIN SUITE

KET, PET, FCE, CAE, CPE – For improved work and study prospects.

Cambridge Main Suite exams are accepted by hundreds of universities and colleges around the world as proof of your English skills and are recognised by employers internationally as proof of your English proficiency.

You can prepare for any of the Cambridge range of exams (KET, PET, FCE, CAE, and CPE) at ESE although the exam you sit for will depend on your level of English on entry. Exams are held three to four times a year.

The course includes guidance on how to improve your study skills and how to become an independent learner, monitored exam practice and mock tests with feedback, monthly tutorials to assess your progress and Students' Podium every Friday.

TOEIC

Test of English for International Communication – For recruitment, admission or graduation purposes.

TOEIC is recognised worldwide and measures and certifies your level of English in an international business environment. The test comes in two forms – the Listening and Reading Test (2 hours) which is paper-based and the Speaking and Writing Test (1 hour 20 mins) which is computer-based.

The tests are widely accepted as an English proficiency test for recruitment purposes and by universities for admission or graduation purposes.

TOEFL iBT

Test of English as a Foreign Language administered via the internet – Demonstrates your ability to use and understand English for academic purposes.

The TOEFL iBT tests your ability to use your core language skills — listening, speaking, reading and writing to perform academic tasks. It is popular with students who are planning to further their studies, with students who need certification to show proof of their English proficiency level and with students and workers applying for visas. It is widely accepted in tertiary institutions in Canada, New Zealand, Australia, UK, South Korea and Ireland.

WHICH COURSE SHOULD I CHOOSE?

Academic Year Course or General English?

We are often asked for guidance on how to choose the right course. You need to determine WHY you are going to study English. Do you need it for your future career? Do you need to sit for an exam to provide proof of your level of English proficiency for university admission or visa purposes? Or are you looking to becoming fluent in English because it is an international language and you feel that it will help you for your personal, work or travel reasons?

The **Academic Year** course is a highlystructured programme which focuses equally on the development of all four core language skills. By the end of the course, you will be more fluent and accurate in all areas of the language. You are required to study outside school hours, participate in team activities, give presentations and take your studies seriously if you want to see results. The course leads to internationally-recognised certification (optional) and may be booked for 12, 24, 30 or 36 weeks and there are 8 start dates thoughout the year. This course is recommended for those students who come with specific language learning objectives in mind, such as wanting to sit for an exam or to reach a certain language level to improve job prospects.

The **General English** course is for those students who want to learn and improve their English for their own personal enrichment and for travel purposes. The course focuses primarily on oral communication and helps you to become more confident through plenty of opportunities to practise speaking English. General English courses start every Monday and may be booked for as many weeks as you wish.


How fast will I progress?

When studying English in a full-immersion context, you can expect to make good progress in a short time. By joining a General English class, your fluency will develop faster and you can expect to go up a level after 8 weeks while with the Academic Year course, since you focus on all 4 skills, progress will be more thorough.

A number of factors will determine which skills you progress faster in and the actual rate of progress. For example, do you want to focus on developing your speaking and fluency or all your core skills? Have you learned a foreign language before? What is your level of attendance? How committed are you to learning? Are you ready to practise using the language as a means of communication outside school hours? All these, and many more reasons, will infuence your rate of progress.

The following progress chart is based in a minimum of 15 hours face-to-face learning in a full-immersion Academic Year course.

If you want to sit for the IELTS, Cambridge or TOEFL iBT exam, intend enrolling on the International Foundation Year programme or furthering your studies at university, this stream allows you to concentrate on Academic English such as study skills, summarising, planning and writing essays and other skills which you need for academic success.

AYC Work Stream

If you want to improve your English for work purposes, this stream allows you to concentrate on using English for business such as writing a good CV, applying for a job, writing business correspondence, answering questions in an interview and other skills which are beneficial for career advancement in any sector. It is also ideal for students who want to prepare for a business exam such as TOEIC, BEC or BULATS.

AYC Fluency Stream

This stream gives you a more structured alternative to long-term General English. By following the Fluency Stream, you develop fluency and become a confident speaker of English as you engage in oral communication activities based on recent and interesting topics in multinational classes.

If you want to improve your overall level of English for a specific goal, such as career advancement or obtaining an English proficiency certificate, the Academic Year course gives you the flexibility of choosing your start date, your preferred area of focus (you can choose which of the specialist streams to follow every six weeks) as well as which exam preparation course to transfer to in the last 10 weeks of the AYC if you wish to obtain an internationally-recognised certificate.

Level 3 International Foundation Diploma for Higher Education Studies is offered as a standard nine month or intensive six month programme, depending on your level of English proficiency on entry.



WORK PLACEMENT

An ESE work placement package gives you the opportunity to experience practical, work-based learning which is relevant to your area of study or interest.

You start your stay in Malta with a week of General English 20 classes which will help you brush up your language skills. During this week you will also be introduced to your line manager at your place of work and shown how to find your way around Malta. As from the second week you will be expected to work for approximately 30 – 36 hours per week (according to your college or university's request) and take lessons of English for Work Purposes or attend a tutorial every Friday.

Bookings must be received at least 14 weeks prior to your desired starting date and although most organisations prefer stays of 12 weeks and over, shorter stays will be considered upon request.
